QV team takes trophy

Quaker Valley's senior high football team was winner of the Black Hills Conference Sportsmanship Trophy this year. It was the third time the award had been made and the first time it had been won by QV.

The trophy is awarded on the basis of votes cast by players, coaches, principals, and athletic directors of opponent schools.

The Black Hills Conference schools this year were Avonworth, Burgettstown, Carlynton, Northgate, West Allegheny, South Park, McGuffey, Peters Township,

Fort Cherry, and QV.

Next year both QV and Northgate will play in the Allegheny Interscholastic Conference - Northern Division. Their opponents will be the much larger schools of Knoch, Richland, Hampton, Deer Lakes, and Mars.

Coch Ken Johns said that the decision to switch the two schools was made by the WPIAL. He described the opportunity to play against the larger schools as "a real challenge."

Soccer for youth comes

For the first time, boys and girls from the Sewickley area will have an opportunity to join a youth soccer club. Boys and girls between the ages of 8 and 12, who will not be 13 before July 1, 1977, are invited to participate and may register by calling 741-5084.

According to Leo Moss, one of the organizers of the club there are several reasons for soccer's soaring popularity as a youth sport. Soccer gives all kids, even those with no experience and limited athletic ability, an opportunity to participate fully in an organized sport; there are no size or strength requirements. It is a game for everyone.

Costs are minimal as well. Almost no special equipment is needed; a whole soccer team can be outfitted for the cost of outfitting one football player.

Soccer is a safe sport. Unlike football, injuries are rare and minor, but soccer is outstanding as a fitness and conditioning activity. In addition soccer teaches skills, coordination, teamwork, and healthy—not fierce—competition.

The emphasis in this Sewickley area soccer club will be on developing skills and on maximizing participation, not on winning, and every child will have an opportunity to play without pressure. The object will be for every boy and girl to

have fun playing soccer whether the team wins or loses.

Games will be played on Sundays starting in April and practice sessions on Saturdays to avoid conflicts with any school activities.

The organizers of the club are anxious to involve as many boys and girls as possible from all elementary and junior high schools in the area, including those who have never played before.

Soccer signup follows trend

Sewickley Area Soccer, the region's newest youth sports program, will hold Fall player registration on Saturday, September 3, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Edgeworth Elementary School Field.

All boys and girls born in the years 1963 through 1969 are eligible to sign up for a full season of soccer competition for a nominal registration fee, however, no one who is unable to pay will be denied the opportunity to play.

Starting with 37 players from the Spring season, more than 130 boys and girls have already signed up during a pre-registration drive held early in the Summer. The unexpectedly large turnout means that Sewickley Area Soccer will form a "house" league with two age-group divisions and all teams playing on local fields with no travel to outlying areas.

Soccer is the fastest growing youth sports program in the country, and the Sewickley area appears to be following the national trend.

Sewickley Area Soccer is a low-keyed program with an emphasis on participation, sportsmanship and evenly-balanced competition. Every child plays at least half of every game regardless of individual skill, awards and trophies are de-emphasized, and parent-coaches are

urged to adopt a low-keyed approach to his or her team.
